Additional Day Camp Information

ALL DAY CAMPERS MUST BRING:

- ☆ Set of twin bed sheets or -----
 - ---Sleeping bag & pillow/pillow case (to be left at camp Monday through Friday for rest time)
- ☼ One large towel each day for swim time
- ☆ Insect repellent and sun screen
- ☆ A change of clothes each day
- The first morning, everyone comes to camp in:
 - ☐ Jean type pants or britches to ride in
 - ☐ RIDING TYPE BOOTS English or Western
- ☆ And Brings:
 - ☐ Shorts, swim suits
 - ☐ Tennis shoes, sandals/thongs for going to dining hall
 - Cap or hat
- ♠ A plastic bag for wet or soiled clothes
- All campers ride in the morning, so Day Campers will arrive at 8:00, wearing riding clothes and boots. Their change of clothes, shoes, and bathing suits, will be for afternoon activities, such as barn chores, vaulting, horse care demonstrations, etc.
- Riding helmets are required (If you do not own one, we will provide one for you.)

PLEASE MARK ALL CLOTHING, PERSONAL BELONGINGS, AND TACK WITH CAMPER'S NAME. ALL CAMPERS MUST PRO-VIDE COMPLETED HEALTH HISTORY FORMS.

NOTE: Grooming equipment and tack will be provided to campers, upon request. A tack users fee of \$10.00 must accompany the balance of the camp fee.

Campers owning their own equipment should bring:

- ☆ Grooming equipment
- ☆ Saddle: including girth and/or fittings
- ☆ Bridle and reins including a safe bit, curb chain, if needed
- ☆ Two (2) saddle pads
- ☆ Good stout halter and lead rope with strong snap
- Any other equipment or tack your individual horse may need
- ♣ Please check all tack carefully to make sure it fits the horse and child, and to see that all rigging is strong, secure, and safe.

CAMPERS WITH THEIR OWN HORSE:

A HEALTH CERTIFICATE AND CURRENT (LESS THAN 12 MONTHS OLD) COGGINS TEST IS REOUIRED.

If your horse is on any medication or has any special problems, please inform the staff in advance.

**Horses are now required to have a health certificate from a Vet within the last ten (10) days & be up to date on all inoculations & inoculated for the Rhino Flu.

- ☆ Owners are asked to sign a release form, holding camp free from liability if horse injures another person, horse or damages property.
- We provide a good, well balanced, horse feed, and clean hay, but campers are welcome to bring their own feed and hay.
- Horses are kept in clean, safe stalls and pens, or pasture.
- All tack is stored separately on racks, and caring for and cleaning this equipment is an important part of the camper's daily routine.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

Campers may not bring chewing gum, snack food, cell phones, computer games, suggestive music, nor clothing exhibiting suggestive graphics. Campers are not allowed to make or receive phone calls nor FAX's.

Even at daycamp, it is not unusual for first-time campers to experience homesickness, and parents should address this prior to registration. We understand the anxiety caused by separation, both for campers and their parents. Please encourage your child to work through this, as we will. It is our policy that homesickness is not cause for leaving camp.

Staff with emergency medical procedure training is on 24 hour duty, and a doctor is on call. All illnesses and accidents are taken seriously and treated appropriately. Parents are called in case of problems.

If you have not met us personally, nor been to Pinebrook Farms, please feel free to call for an appointment and make plans to come by and visit with us and see our facilities.
