

Additional Day Camp Information

ALL DAY CAMPERS MUST BRING:

- ☆ Set of twin bed sheets or sleeping bag & pillow/pillow case (to be left at camp Monday to Friday for rest time)
- ☆ One large towel each day for swim time
- ☆ Insect repellent and sun screen
- ☆ A change of clothes each day
- ☆ The first morning, everyone comes to camp in:
 - Jean type pants or britches to ride in
 - RIDING TYPE BOOTS – English or Western
- ☆ And Brings:
 - Shorts, swim suits, T shirts, (no spaghetti straps, halters, or midriff shirts).
 - Tennis shoes, sandals/thongs for going to dining hall
 - Cap or hat
- ☆ A plastic bag for wet or soiled clothes
- ☆ After the first day, you will your know your child's schedule. On days when they ride in the a.m. they will wear riding pants & bring play clothes for p.m. activities. On days when they ride in p.m. they will wear play clothes and bring riding pants for riding in the p.m.
- ☆ **Riding helmets are required** (If you do not own one, we will provide one for you.)

PLEASE MARK ALL CLOTHING, PERSONAL BELONGINGS, AND TACK WITH CAMPER'S NAME. ALL CAMPERS MUST PROVIDE COMPLETED HEALTH HISTORY FORMS.

NOTE: Grooming equipment and tack will be provided to campers, upon request. A tack users fee of \$10.00 must accompany the balance of the camp fee.

Campers bringing their own horse and/or equipment should bring the following items to camp:

- ☆ Grooming equipment
- ☆ Saddle: including girth/cinch and/or fittings
- ☆ Bridle and reins including a safe bit, curb chain, if needed
- ☆ Two (2) saddle pads
- ☆ Good stout halter and lead rope with strong snap
- ☆ Any other equipment or tack your individual horse may need
- ☆ Please check all tack carefully to make sure it fits the horse and child, and to see that all rigging is strong, secure, and safe.

Day Camps are Monday thru Friday from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

Day Camp registration is Monday - 8:00 A.M. - 9:00 A.M.

CAMPERS WITH THEIR OWN HORSE:

A HEALTH CERTIFICATE AND CURRENT (LESS THAN 12 MONTHS OLD) COGGINS TEST IS REQUIRED.

- If your horse is on medication or has any special problems, please inform the staff in advance.
- Day Campers may board horses here for the 5 days, rather than trailer them each day. Board is \$10.00 a day.

****Horses are required to have a health certificate from a Veterinarian within the last ten (10) days & be up to date on all inoculations including Rhino Flu.**

- ☆ Owners are asked to sign a release form, holding camp free from liability if horse injures any person, horse or damages property.
- ☆ We provide a good, well balanced, horse feed, and clean hay, but campers are welcome to bring their own feed and hay.
- ☆ Horses are kept in clean, safe stalls and pens, or pasture.
- ☆ All tack is stored separately on racks, and caring for and cleaning this equipment is an important part of the camper's daily routine.

Optional Expenses:

Camp shirts \$15.00 - Camp hats \$15.00 Visors \$11.00 – Bandanas \$3.00.
Snack bar provided at no extra cost.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

Campers may not bring gum, snacks, computer games, cell phones, suggestive music, nor clothing exhibiting suggestive graphics. Campers are not allowed to make or receive phone calls, FAX's, or eMail.

Even at day camp, it is not unusual for first-time campers to experience homesickness, and parents should address this prior to registration. We understand the anxiety caused by separation, both for campers and their parents. Please encourage your child to work through this, as we will. It is our policy that homesickness is not cause for leaving camp.

Staff with emergency medical procedure training is on 24 hour duty, and a doctor is on call. All illnesses and accidents are taken seriously and treated appropriately. Parents are called in case of problems.
