

Additional Harvest Moon Clinic Information

PINEBROOK FARMS' Harvest Moon Horsemanship Clinics are held Saturday, 1:00 p.m. thru Sunday, 4:00 p.m., as overnight mini-camps or clinics. Their purpose is to provide youngsters, from 7 to 15 years, with an opportunity to improve their horsemanship skills while having a great time in a safe, family orientated, environment. Activities include six hours of lessons, a costume party, free pumpkins, scare-crow making, games, prizes, trail rides, a cook out, and "moonlight" surprises.

Riding in the fall can be fun and challenging. While the bunkhouses and dining hall are air conditioned & heated, please prepare Students to be warm and dry while riding and enjoying outdoor activities in cooler weather.

ALL PARTICIPANTS/STUDENTS MUST BRING:

- ☆ Sleeping bag & pillow/pillow case
- ☆ Set of twin bed sheets
- ☆ One (1) large towel and wash cloth
- ☆ One (1) flashlight
- ☆ Personal toiletry articles
- ☆ "Every-Day" Clothes for two (2) days
 - Jean type pants or britches to ride in
 - Smooth sole riding boots: No one will be allowed to ride in hiking boots or tennis shoes, except "Heels Down" type.
 - Casual clothes and tennis shoes for afternoon activities, jackets, gloves and raincoats appropriate for weather conditions.
 - Cap or hat
- ☆ Dirty clothes bag.
- ☆ **No footlockers or trunks** - soft suitcases (8"-10" thick or less) for under bed storage. 8" thick "Under Bed Storage Boxes" work well.
- ☆ Costume for horse and rider. Must be safe and simple.
- ☆ **Riding helmets are required** (If you do not own one, we will provide one for you.)

PLEASE MARK ALL CLOTHING AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS WITH STUDENT'S NAME.

Grooming equipment provided:

(You may bring your own if you prefer)

- ☆ Curry brush
- ☆ Body brush
- ☆ Finish brush
- ☆ Mane comb
- ☆ Hoof pick
- ☆ Sweat scraper
- ☆ Saddle: including girth and/or fittings
- ☆ Bridle and reins including a safe bit, curb chain, if needed
- ☆ Two (2) saddle pads
- ☆ Good stout halter and lead rope with strong snap
- ☆ Any other equipment or tack your individual horse may need
- ☆ Safe costume for horse and rider



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STUDENTS WITH THEIR OWN HORSE:

A HEALTH CERTIFICATE, CURRENT COGGINS TEST, AND A HORSE OWNER'S RELEASE FORM IS REQUIRED.

If your horse is on any medication or has any special problems, please inform the staff in advance.

- ☆ We provide a good, well balanced horse feed, & clean, nutritious hay.
- ☆ Students may bring their own feed and hay but there is no reduction in clinic fee.
- ☆ Horses are kept in clean, safe stalls & pens, or in pasture if requested.
- ☆ Please check all tack carefully to make sure it fits the horse and child (child's feet must reach the stirrups). Make sure all rigging is strong, secure, and safe.
- ☆ All tack is stored separately on racks. Caring for and cleaning this equipment is an important part of the student's daily routine.
- ☆ Students are encouraged to bring "every-day" tack, if possible, rather than new "show tack."

STUDENTS MUST NOT BRING:

Foot lockers, cell phones, snack food, gum, electronic games, suggestive music, nor clothing exhibiting student's midsection or with suggestive graphics.

PLEASE MARK ALL EQUIPMENT WITH STUDENT'S NAME.
